## OUR GRAND CRUS FROM NORTH TO SOUTH

### Chambertin Grand Cru

Surface area: 0,17 hectare - average production 700 bottles; the grapes tend to ripen late on this gentle, east-facing slope. Patience is everything.

### Echezeaux Grand Cru

Surface area: 1 hectare - average production 3,600 bottles; from the "Les Champs Traversins" vineyard on a slope whose particularly well-drained soil lends this wine its characteristic elegance.

### Grands-Echezeaux Grand Cru

Surface area: 0,25 hectare - average production 1,000 bottles; the shallow soil containing clay mixed in with the parent rock influences this wine's power and distinction.

### Clos-de-Vougeot Grand Cru

Surface area: 0,63 hectare - average production 2,700 bottles; gentle slope with plots that link the lower and upper parts of the vineyard which allows for the production of grapes that express a great deal of fruit in the lower part as well as grapes that lend structure and body from the upper part. East/south-eastern exposure.

### Richebourg Grand Cru

Surface area: 0,07 hectare - average production 300 bottles; influenced by the valley of Concéur and proximity to the parent rock which give this wine its precision.

## OUR "VILLAGES" AND PREMIER CRUS FROM NORTH TO SOUTH

### Gevrey-Chambertin «Les Murots»

Surface area: 1,5 hectares - average production 9,000 bottles; very unique soil containing aggregate and limestone scree deposits from the ice age.

### Nuits-Saint-Georges

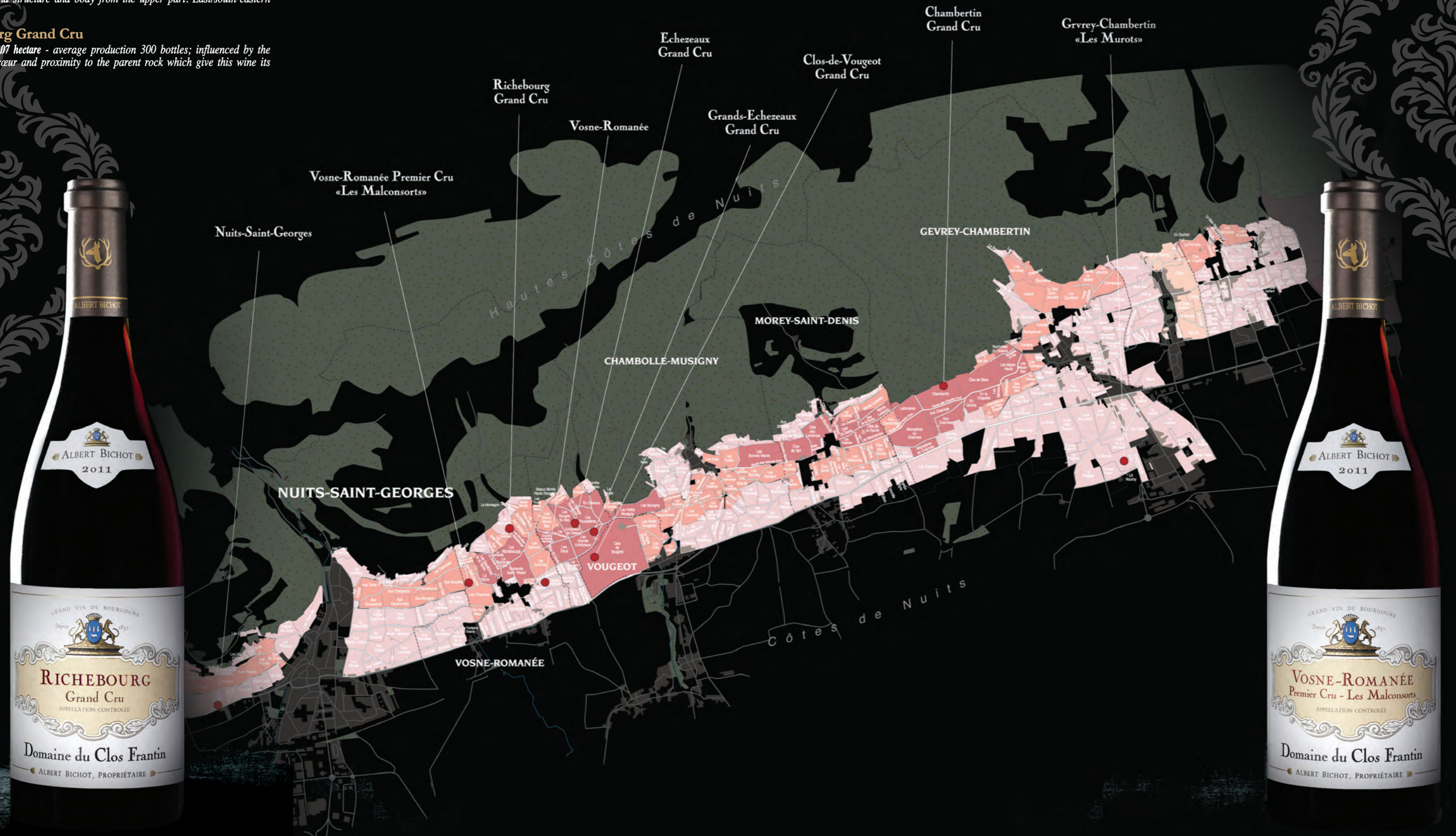
Surface area: 0,83 hectare - average production 5,000 bottles; located at the top of the slope.

### Vosne Romanée

Surface area: 1,10 hectares - average production 6,000 bottles; from the "Les Damaudes" and "Les Maizières" vineyards, an alliance of two very different yet superbly complementary terroirs.

### Vosne-Romanée Premier Cru «Les Malconsorts»

Surface area: 1,75 hectares - average production 8,500 bottles; a particularly sunny microclimate that lends power and body to the wines. The different nuances of soils within our plot add complexity to this wine.

*Faithful to its cultural heritage, since 1831 the Bichot family has strived to preserve and maintain all that defines Burgundy and its magic: its terroirs and appellations. Albert Bichot owns a Château and four Estates located at the heart of the different viticultural areas that make up Burgundy, from Chablis in the north to Mercurey in the south. It was in 1969 that the family acquired Domaine du Clos Frantin in Nuits-Saint-Georges at the heart of the Côte de Nuits, home to Burgundy's rarest and most prestigious appellations where the Pinot Noir grape truly flourishes.*

*If you follow the driveway lined with truffle oaks, you will come upon an impressive 18th-century residence at a curve in the road that consists of a large house, winery and cellar. In the same spirit as at Domaine Long-Depaquit in Chablis and at Domaine du Pavillon in Pommard, a dedicated team oversees work in the vineyards and throughout the vinification process, focusing on respect for both natural balances in the vineyard as well as the integrity of the fruit. Without such care, no great wine could ever be produced.*

### **SHOWCASING BURGUNDY'S UNIQUE, PRIVILEGED TERROIRS :**

*With 7.3 hectares of vines in the villages around Nuits-Saint-Georges, Vosne-Romanée, Vougeot, Flagey-Echezeaux and Gevrey-Chambertin, the Estate's team supervises different levels of appellation, from village appellations to Grand Crus.*

*Their know-how is also put to use in purchasing grapes from neighbouring plots that are vinified in the same spirit.*

### **AN "HAUTE COUTURE" WINERY THAT RESPECTS TRADITION :**

*Following major renovations, the winery now features modern vinification equipment that is adapted to the traditional methods we continue to use.*

- *48 traditional temperature-controlled open wooden vats allow us to vinify the entire range of our wines.*
- *The cellar is located just beneath the winery, which allows the wine to be transferred to its 800 barrels using gravity.*
- *Relatively stable hygrometry and temperature allow us to conduct long phases of malolactic fermentation before the wines are aged.*

### **BURGUNDY, RARE AND PRESTIGIOUS :**

*Burgundy is a unique, specific region. Though it is one of the world's smallest viticultural zones, it produces some of the most prestigious wines and boasts a winegrowing culture that is proud of its traditions and history.*

*It is the sharing of these values and the desire to share them with future generations that led the Bichot family to join the Association des Climats de Bourgogne as a major benefactor in support of the bid for Burgundy's vineyards to be included on the UNESCO world heritage list.*
